School Description: The Alabama School of Fine Arts (ASFA) is a partially residential,

competitively admitted, public school dedicated to providing gifted and talented middle— and high school students intensive instruction in one of six dedicated specialty areas: Creative Writing, Dance, Math/Science, Music, Theatre Arts, and Visual Arts. Students also receive superior

college-prep instruction in academic core subjects.

Performance Responsibilities:

 Teach creative writing workshops, forms courses, and/or special topics courses in media arts to advanced Creative Writing students in grades 7 – 12. (Up to three courses per day, per semester.)

- Teach department-specific electives or other service courses/responsibilities (e.g., study hall or homeroom) to the general school population, as needed.
- Collaborate with Creative Writing Chair / Media Arts Coordinator and other faculty to establish and maintain consistency in departmental curriculum, instruction, and student performance.
- Assist Creative Writing Chair / Media Arts Coordinator and other faculty with outreach
 work and department events, including student readings, student film festival, visiting
 artists, summer day camp, and community functions, as needed.
- Assist, as needed, with production of the department's student media publications, including the literary magazine (*Cadence*), on-line student media platform (*The Star*), and other related productions.
- Establish and maintain standards of student behavior to achieve an exceptional learning atmosphere in a unique school environment.
- Engage with colleagues and Student Support staff to reinforce schoolwide Social and Emotional Learning initiatives and to ensure individual student wellness.
- Communicate clearly and effectively with students, parents/guardians, colleagues, and community groups, in a variety of settings and situations (e.g., phone, email, one-on-one interaction, classroom instruction, speaking to medium/large sized groups).
- Maintain and submit records and reports, as required by school and/or statewide policy.

- Preferred: B.F.A. or higher degree in Creative Writing, Media Arts, or related field.
 Consistent evidence of creative production/publication. Substantial teaching experience, especially working with middle— and high school students, in academic or alternative settings.
- Such alternatives to the above qualifications as the President may find appropriate and acceptable.
